# America 250 Scavenger Hunt Questions

Each clue is followed by the number of the historical marker that will give you the answer.

**401 Greene Street** - Who commanded the Continental Army in the Battle of Hobkirk Hill?

**HMDB Entry #19**

**502 East DeKalb Street** - Name the Major General buried here who was mortally wounded at the Battle of Camden. **HMDB Entry #114**

**956 Broad Street** - This Catawba Indian is often called the Patron Saint of Camden.

**HMDB Entry #65**

**528 King Street** - What future president was imprisoned at the jail (gaol) that stood here in 1781?

**HMDB Entry #51**

**607 Broad Street** - The original tombstone of this man is mounted on the wall behind the front steps of this building. As he was being treated at a British military hospital he said: “I die the death I always prayed for, the death of a soldier fighting for the rights of man.” **HMDB Entry #125**

**606 Bull Street** - Our county is named after this man who was a very influential businessman, soldier, and politician. Marker

**HMDB Entry #36**

**222 Broad Street** - This house was originally built by Joseph Kershaw. During the British occupation of Camden, it served as headquarters of several British officers. **HMDB Entry #64**

**601 Meeting Street** - Near the Revolutionary War Memorial are markers added for several unknown soldiers discovered at the Battle of Camden site. How many unknown soldiers were reinterred here in 2023? **HMDB Entry #93**

**602 Meeting Street** - The Camden Oak served as a Witness Tree - “witnessing” the rebirth of Camden after the Revolutionary War. Which President did this tree witness visiting Camden? **HMDB Entry #111**
